We began the term with an **ANZAC Day** memorial service where students and staff prepared for this by learning about this part of our history and the different symbols used to commemorate the ANZACs. All classes created wreaths that were laid in the garden with other photos of family members to be remembered. Students across all classes read poems and sang songs and listened respectfully to The Last Post and Requiem after which we all shared an ANZAC biscuit before returning to class. We were all very proud of how well behaved and respectful all students were, and grateful to see parents who were able to attend to support and encourage the children through the event.

This term, we began our **Bush Kindy** program with over 20 families attending the first session. With so many families on the wait list, we decided to offer a second (albeit shorter) group for Bush Kindy this term. We have also begun the expressions of interest list for Term 2 BK, which is filling fast. Bush Kindy is one of the great additions to our school that allows families to see the amazing learning opportunities at Enkindle Village School. The families who attended in Week 2 enjoyed sitting under the tree to read and draw and play games, or splashed in the slow-running creek, or panned for gold and gems, or followed some other mystery at Wooda Mooli Base Camp. Seeing small children investigate and imagine amazing ideas is truly magical and we are so fortunate to have wonderful staff who support children and families in this part of their learning journey.



We have a new tree in our school! A mural of a green Enkindle tree, painted by our wonderful parent - Jerika, is on a wall in the principal's office and will be used by adding student names and good deeds/successes to leaves that are then added to the tree. The purpose of the tree is to acknowledge that we are always growing and that we all have different types of success whether this is academic, social, personal, sporting, artistically, or in any other way. After a week-long democratic process where students first suggested names and slogans for the tree and then voted, a very close election outcome was arrived at after a vote of 47 students and staff voted was decided with a one vote difference.

At school circle, we announced that the name of the tree will be 'The Tree of Growth' and the slogan will be 'Where possibilities grow'. Thank you to all our voters and to those who nominate other great options and accept the democratic outcome. There is the option to change to a code you prefer, which can be used both in the app and at the new kiosk at Admin. If you forget your code, Aimie will be able to help you with this.

Mothers' Day: It was wonderful to share morning tea with our wonderful families where we celebrated all the mothers, grandmothers, and other motherly figures in our lives. Students and staff prepared an array of cakes, slices, biscuits, and fairy bread to share as a caring and connected village. 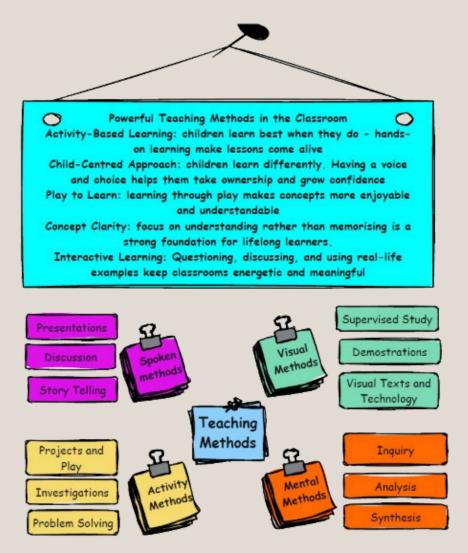

Forest School Meets the Stage

This term, Forest School has taken a dramatic twist, literally! With a strong focus Drama, our students have been diving deep into role play, storytelling, and performance. Thanks to a \$2 vintage curtain treasure from the op shop, we've transformed the bush into our very own Forest School Theatre! There's been no shortage of imagination, from snow-filled creek adventures to bear hunts and wild survival scenarios. Students have been learning essential outdoor skills like setting up tents, hammocks, and sleeping bags, then bringing those skills into their stories. Bonfires have become both a practical and theatrical centrepiece, keeping us warm and "cooking" our freshly caught (pretend!) bears.

In addition to the drama unfolding on our forest school stage, we've also been working collaboratively on a beautiful mural of Wadda Mooli Creek using only natural materials. Through this process, students are deepening their understanding of our native wildlife, the wet and dry seasons, and observing the changes in our beloved creek since Term 1. It's been a term of wonder, expression, and deep connection to Country.

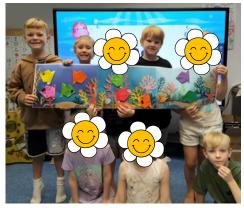

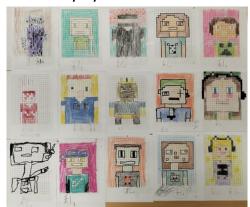
Year 2 students are going under the sea with ocean creatures, and learning to count beyond 10.

What is RESET?

- RESET is a Wellbeing Framework of specific body-breath-mind strategies proven to enhance physical, mental-emotional, and social wellbeing for adults and youth.
- RESET Programs provide trauma-informed classes and education for communities seeking to support self-care, self-awareness and self-regulation.
- Youth RESET is a certified social enterprise delivering wellness education, classes, workshops, training and resources.



Focused Mindful Movement merges the body and the breath to develop self-awareness and physical health through improved posture, circulation, energy, strength, flexibility, balance, mood, focus, and concentration.



Conscious Efficient Breathing is also called diaphragmatic breathing which engages the Parasympathetic Nervous System (PNS) informing the brain of safety and time to rest, digest and recover. This pathway to homeostasis is essential for stress relief, emotional regulation, improved focus, cognition, sleep, immunity, and whole-health.



Meditation Foundations are self-awareness strategies that observe the mind. This process fosters reflection, self-acceptance, patience, compassion, self-realisation, empathy, gratitude, growth mindset and mental fitness. Neurological and social research confirms how meditation supports well-being, brain development, memory, imagination and critical thinking. Empirical studies have also shown how metacognition development is effective in decreasing addictive behaviours.
